Will of Edward Avery, Chipping Norton 1617

In the name of god amen The eight and twentyeth day of Aprill
in the yeare of our lord god one thousand syx hundred and
seaventeene I Edward Avery of Chippingnorton in the countie
of Oxon Weake in bodie, but stronge in mynde and of
good and p[er]fect memory thankes be to god, doe ordeyne
and make this my last will and testament in manner
and forme followinge Fyrste I doe Willingly and w[i]th
a free heart render and gyve againe into the handes of
my lord god and Creator, my spirit w[hi]ch he of his fatherly
goodnes gave unto me, makeing me a lyveing & resonable
creature, nothing doubtinge but that for his infynite
mercyes set forth in the p[re]cious bloud of his deerly
beloved sonne Jesus Christe our only saviour & redeemer
he will receyve my soule into his glory and place
yt in the company of the heavenly Angells and blessed
saintes And as concerning my body I gyve it over
commending it to the earth hopeing assuredly of a
blessed resurrection. It[e]m I gyve to John Avery my
sonne one platter to Will[ia]m Avery my sonne one platter
to Thomas my sonne one platter, to Samuell my sonne
one platter to Edward, my sonne one platter and to
Margaret my daughter one platter All the rest
of my goodes and chattells moveables and unmoveables
my debtes paied, my funerall dischardged and my legacyes
hearin bequeathed satysfyed I gyve and bequeath to
Judyth my Wyef whome I make my whole executrix
and I appoint my loveing brothers in lawe Rychard
Berry and Thomas Hyett my overseers In witnes
wherof I have hearunto set my hand & seale
the day and yeare fyrst above written.
