On this Twentieth day of August 1832 - Daniel Appell personally appeared in open Court before the Court of Probate, now sitting at Hillsborough, within and for the County of Hillsborough, in the State aforesaid, Daniel Appell of Mount Vernon in the County of Hillsboro,

aged 70 years Who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7th, 1832. That he entered the service of the United States, under the following named officers, and served as herein stated. That is to say, In July or August of

3- the year 1780 I enlisted under Capt. Babner, for the term of three months and joined the Regiment under Col. Nichols at West Point and I was at Robinsons Farm, when General Arnold deserted the American cause and I served out my term of three months, and about one fortnight more and was discharged at St. West Point -- do not recollect the day

Also in 1781 I again entered the service (I think in August) under Capt. John Mills of N. Hampshire Militia, for three months the company was destined for West Point, but we attached to Springfield in Mass. when the Captain recd. orders to turn and go to Charlestown N. Hampshire, which he did, and I with one other man, followed in a day or two after and joined the company immediately after their arrival at Charlestown, where we were stationed during the whole term of three months but were not joined to any Regiment and were then discharged, and I returned home

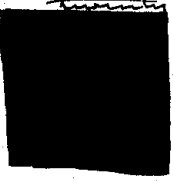

4. How were you called into service, were you drafted, did you volunteer, or were you a substitute, and if a substitute, for whom? Answer, *I volunteered*

5. State the names of some of the regular Officers, who were with the troops, where you served, such Continental and Militia Regiments, as you can recollect, and the general circumstances of your service?

Answer, *at West Point, Col. Nichol, Gen. Arnold - Capt. Humes a Regt. of Jersey men*

6. Did you ever receive a discharge from the service, and if so, by whom was it given, and what has become of it? Answer, *No discharge*

7. State the names of persons to whom you are known in your present neighborhood, and who can testify as to your character for veracity, and their belief of your services as a Soldier of the Revolution?

Answer, *John Carleton Esq. John Hume Esq. Nathaniel Tringsey Jacob Levetis*

On this Eighth day of February A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the county and State aforesaid, Mary

Averill aged seventy seven years, a resident of Mont Vernon in the State of New Hampshire, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Daniel Averill, deceased; who was a private in the company commanded by Captains Barnes and Mills in the Regiment commanded by Col Nichols and others, in the Revolutionary War,

the time he entered the service during said war, but the particular time he entered or the time he left the service is not within her knowledge, that he continued in said war for the term of six months or more, and was honorably discharged.

She further states that she was married to the said Daniel Averill in Mont Vernon aforesaid on the twenty sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven by Nathaniel Kingsbury, a minister of the Gospel, and that her name before her said marriage was Mary Manning; that her said husband died at Barris in the state of Vermont on or about the twenty fifth day of April A.D. one thousand eight hundred and forty eight, and that she is now a widow. For proof of her said husband's service aforesaid she

Refers to evidence on file in the Pension Office which the said Daniel Arvill, her said husband furnished to procure his Pension Certificate under the Law of the United States, of the 7th June 1832, and the records in the War Department. For proof of her marriage civil identity she refers to Evidence herewith sent and Evidence now on file in the Pension Office which she furnished to procure a pension under the act of February 2, 1853. That she is now a Pensioner under this act.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be entitled under the act approved March 3, 1855. That said Certificate, when issued be sent to Nathaniel Bree.
