State of Massachusetts

I, Ezekiel Cowen a citizen of the United States, now resident at Alna in the County of Lincoln and State aforesaid, do hereby testify and declare, that in the war of the revolution, on the 11th day of October A.D. 1777. I entered and was engaged in the land service of the United States on the continental establishment and served accordingly from that time to the 11th day of October 1780. as a private soldier against the common enemy, without any interruption or absence: that I belonged to a company, part of the time commanded by Lieut. Lamb. & part of the time by Capt. Nath. Hunt, in the 10th Regiment of the Massachusetts line under the command of Col. Henry Jackson, and that I left the service on the 11th day of October aforesaid at West Point, & that by reason of my reduced circumstances in life & poverty I stand in need of assistance from my country for support, being now of the age of sixty two years, that I was in the battle of Monmouth, and in an action on Rhode Island, & received a ^{regular} discharge which I have lost; the annexed paper is an original order I received to draw provisions, on the day of my discharge, & that I have no further evidence now in my power of said service,

And I hereby relinquish all claims to every pension heretofore allowed me by the laws of the United States, if any may be or have been so allowed

LINCOLN, ss.....At a Circuit Court of Common Pleas for the second Eastern Circuit, begun and holden at Wiscasset, within and for the County of Lincoln, on the third Tuesday, being the twentieth day of June, and by adjournment from day to day, on the day of in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty, before the Honorable JOSIAH STEBBINS & EBENEZER THATCHER, Judges of said Court.

ON this twentieth day of June in the year 1820, personally appeared in open Court.

the same proceeding according to the course of the common law, having jurisdiction unlimited in amount, keeping a record of their proceedings, and having "the power of fine and imprisonment," and being a Court of Record for said Circuit, Ezekiel Averill aged Sixty four years, resident in Alma in said Circuit, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows, viz. as a Private in the company commanded by Capt. Thomas Hunt in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Jackson in the line of the State of Massachusetts on the Continental Establishment, as is more particularly mentioned and described in his original declaration, made on the twenty fifth day of April A. D. 1818, and on which said declaration his Certificate of Pension, numbered 2116 was granted. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818: and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed, that my occupation and ability to pursue the same, together with the number and other particulars of my family, are in fact and in truth as is particularly described on the back hereof, also subscribed by me.
